



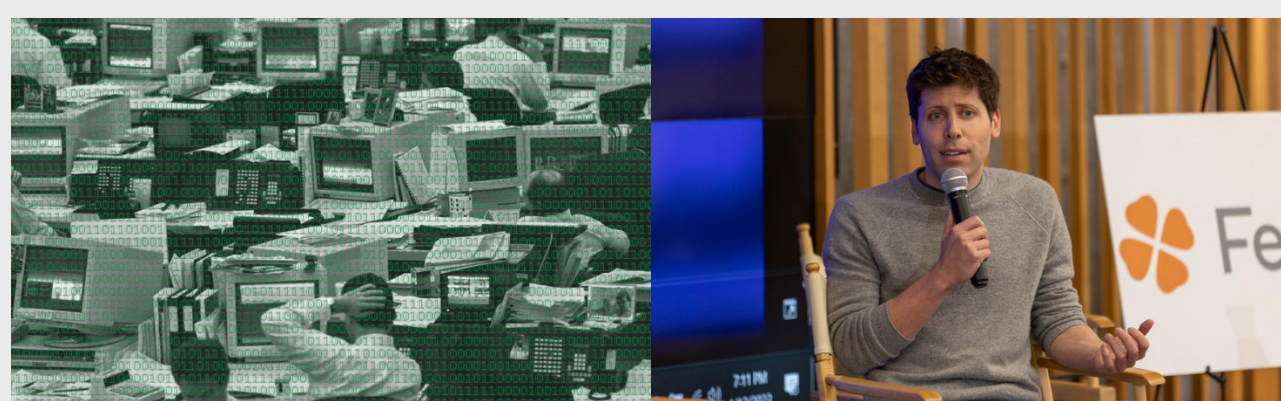
**Why OpenAI's ChatGPT Is Such A Big Deal**
